WHEREAS; the bald eagle is the central image used in the Great Seal of the United States and in the logos of many branches of the U.S. Government; and

WHEREAS; the bald eagle's image, meaning, and symbolism have played significant roles in the beliefs, traditions, lifestyles, and heritage of Americans from all walks of life; and

WHEREAS; the bald eagle's image, meaning, and symbolism have played significant roles in American art, music, literature, architecture, commerce, education, and culture; and

WHEREAS; the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service removed the bald eagle from the Endangered Species Act protection in 2007, and eagle recovery efforts, including habitat protection and nest monitoring in Wisconsin are ongoing;
