





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Bald eaglets grow rapidly!  
They add a pound or half  
pound to their weight every  
week until they are about nine  
to ten weeks old.

In just ten to fourteen weeks  
after hatching, a bald eaglet  
will fledge, or fly away from,  
the nest.





## DID YOU KNOW?

It can take up to 5 years for a bald eagle to develop their iconic white head and tail. Young bald eagles have mostly brown heads, dark beaks, and eyes. During the first four years of their lives they go through a series of color changes with their plumage patterns, eye color, and beak color.

# DID YOU KNOW?

Bald eagles are unique to North America, you've probably heard of America's other eagle - The Golden eagle. Golden eagles live throughout much of the northern hemisphere. But the bald eagle is only found in North America. The bald eagle can be found across much of Canada and the U.S., as well as parts of Mexico.
